

EXCEPTIONAL PERFORMANCE AWARD

APWA PROFESSIONAL AWARDS

PURPOSE Established in 1996, this award recognizes individuals, teams, or organizations in the areas of adversity, journalism, and safety whose outstanding contributions in the course of performance raises the level of public awareness of the profession, specifically:

Adversity Recognizes exceptional performance in the face of adversity in service to the public.

Journalism Recognizes exceptional performance in presenting the story of a public works issue or event that projects a positive image of individuals or agencies in the course of their performance in both broadcast and print mediums.

Safety Recognizes exceptional performance in the area of safety.

Eligibility Candidates may be an individual, team, or group of individuals or organizations meeting the purpose of the award. APWA membership is not required.

SELECTION The Awards Committee reviews the nominations and selects the award winners.

NOMINATION PROCESS Nominations may be made by an APWA chapter, entity, or individual APWA members or nonmembers. Nominations must include nomination form and documentation supporting the purpose of the award and the award's eligibility requirements. Six copies of submittal are required. Submission for Exceptional Performance Award—Journalism must include the actual article/copy/transcript. Video tapes are welcomed and will be used in the judging process. These materials should be sent to APWA National. Materials submitted in support of nomination will not be returned.

DEADLINE March 2, 2009

PRESENTATION The winners are presented with a plaque at the Awards Recognition Ceremony during the APWA International Public Works Congress & Exposition and are featured in APWA's publications.
